Coaches . . . Don't Reinvent the Wheel!

There are lots of great FREE web-based applications out there! Many people have already created games, resources, study guides, etc., for the topics covered in Future Problem Solving. Using a variety of resources keeps the students engaged and helps them delve into the topics in a more meaningful way. The following list of web-based applications was shared at IC last June by Robin Addie, Affiliate Director of West Virginia FPS. I hope you will find something useful to use with your students!



Symbaloo.com -- a cloud-based application that allows users to organize and categorize web links in the form of buttons. It is free to sign up.

 Login and click on "Search Webmixes." Then, type in a topic, such as "drones" or "criminal justice systems." This enables you -- or better yet someone else -- to create a group of weblinks on one specific topic in one convenient location.

Quizlet.com -- a mobile and web-based study application that allows students to study information via learning tools and games.

• Under the search bar at the top of the page, type in "Future Problem Solving," "Stress," or any topic to find a Quizlet that matches your needs.

Kahoot.com -- a game-based learning platform used as educational technology in schools and other educational institutions.

- Under the search bar at the top of the page, you can search "Find Kahoots" for any FPS topic.
- There are Kahoots for the FPS process, Kathoots for each topic, etc.
- Many educators have their students make Kahoots, so be aware of potential spelling errors and incorrect answers.
- Always check Kahoots before playing them.
- Kathoots can be made public, so there are always many to choose from.

Nearpod.com -- an interactive classroom tool for teachers to engage students with interactive lessons.

- Unlike Kahoots and Quizlets, Nearpod lessons are NOT public.
- If you wish to have access to a Nearpod on a particular subject, you will need to have to creator of the Nearpod "share" it with you.
- The company also has a wide variety of Nearpods available.
- While it is free to sign up for the "Silver User," not all Nearpod lessons are free.
- Educators can always preview any Nearpod to see if it matches their needs. And, of course, educators can easily create their own customized lessons.
- Also know that with the "Silver User," educators can assign lessons to your students ONLY as
 "Live Lesson" where the teacher controls each screen. If the educator upgrades to a "Gold User,"
 then "Student-paced" lessons can be assigned.

Other useful websites:

Edmodo.com -- an educational technology company offering a communication, collaboration, and coaching platform to K-12 schools and teachers. Edmodo offers microblogging, link and file sharing, inline replies, a class calendar, and assignments and grading functions all in a Twitter-like package built with the classroom in mind.

Animoto.com -- a cloud-based video creation service that produces video from photos, video clips, and music into video slideshows. Students can create their own informational videos on a topic.

Smore.com - allows its users to design single-page websites for marketing an idea, promoting an event or selling a product. FPSPI uses Smore to create posters promoting topics.
